## Publisher App

Following discussions with business representatives on the design of the new Pub App, we have recently started to build the system.


The App is effectively an extension of the SAP Order to Cash (OTC) system that is designed for use by staff in the publishing divisions. It will also use stock data from the JDA warehouse management system.

Keytree are our integration partners for SAP OTC. While we work closely with their UK-based representatives on system design, the build work is undertaken by their development team in Spain. Senior Project Manager Ian Duffy visited their Madrid office in October to oversee the start of the build for the Pub App.



The image above includes developers Jose, Max, Juan, Saul, Wojtek and Diego. So far, they have built a technical link with the main OTC system and have created the App's landing page, log-in process and title search functionality.

Pages that show stock and sales information for individual titles are now being created with initial testing to take place early next year.



## Construction News



On 6<sup>th</sup> October, we reached a key project milestone with the practical completion of the internal fit-out of the warehouse. This includes the installation of racking, machinery and electrical cables and it follows the completion of the external building work in July.

Winvic, the main contractors that undertook the construction, have now completed their work and the keys to the building have effectively been handed over to Hachette UK.

We are now in a period of snagging to address minor outstanding tasks and in the coming months we will focus on decorating the office space and installing furniture.

## Customer Engagement

Engagement with key customers is progressing well. Richard Bevan, the project's Change Manager, has been liaising with UK customers since September. He also visited the Frankfurt Book Fair in mid-October to engage with a series of international customers.

This was to share an overview of the project scope, timelines and potential impacts.
